



CARIBBEAN STUDIES

CAR 110. INTRODUCTION TO CARIBBEAN STUDIES.

This course provides an overview of issues critical to the development of the Caribbean. It aims to make students think critically about policies and projects developed for Caribbean countries and propose solutions to problems they have identified as important to their communities and the wider Caribbean region. The ultimate goal of the course is to enhance students' sense of their potential and responsibilities as citizens of the Caribbean community.

CAR 231. CARIBBEAN CULTURE AND SOCIETY.

A comparative study of the development of Caribbean culture and society from colonial times to the present. Includes a case study of the Netherlands Antilles. Special attention will be given to the twentieth century and topics such as labor unrest, relations between the U.S. and the Caribbean, Marcus Garvey, Negritude, and Pan Africanism.

Prerequisite: English 111.
